# Belmont Pumpkin Farm open for fall fun

After being closed for 2020, the Belmont Pumpkin Farm at North is open again. Last year, the farm was forced to close for the first time in the more than 30 years it has been in operation.

The reason for the farm's closure last year can largely be blamed on an unusually wet planting season, said owner Cammie Gustafson Flanagan. Within about 10 days, 10 inches of rain fell onto the farm, drowning the pumpkins.

With the lost crops and the continued threat of COVID, Flanagan said it was as good as any time to be closed. However, she said they felt stuck not being able to do or accomplish much. She said she stayed hopeful that the farm would reopen this year.

The same factors that caused 2020's closure threatened the farm again this year, said Flanagan. This season's first planting of 40 rows were hit with several inches of rain. She said after about two weeks, they planted again but only for 15 rows. Despite the smaller number, she said there are 15 different varieties of pumpkins in the fields.

## **Camellias come** alive in fall

If you are searching for a pretty plant to begin blooming this fall in your garden, look no further than the ca-

Lewis Hubbard of Cardinal, enjoys his camellias yearround, especially when they begin to bloom in the late fall.

"Ī happen to love camellias," said Hubbard.

And love them he does. Hubbard has approximately 85 camellia plants of all shapes, sizes, colors and blooms. Some like the sunlight, while others thrive in shady environments. All of his camellias are perfectly planted and arranged around his house, in his backyard and they are also placed at the front of the drive to welcome visitors.

"They're a pretty plant," he said Hubbard.

Some of his eye-catching camellias include the Junie Lancaster of the species Japonica which has light red blooms with yellow anthers and pink filaments; Autumn Rocket belongs to the Sasanqua species ray of colors.

and is white with yellow anthers and white filaments; and his favorite being the Donckelarii of the species Japonica which varies in color.

"I love this plant because you don't know what you're going to get," he said about the Donckelarii.

Hubbard started his labor of love 20 years ago when he moved to Cardinal from Texas. Camellias bloom for a lot longer than azaleas, said Hubbard on why he decided to begin planting camellias. In fact, Hubbard has had camellias bloom for two or three months.

"They just get prettier and prettier," he said.

Hubbard also has a camellia called the Crimson Candle of the species Reticulata Hybrid. It is a bright rose-red color with golden anthers an pinkish-white filaments.

"They're all pretty in their own way," he said.

Hubbard said that the camellias will begin to bloom in November, covering his nearly two-acre property in an ar-





### VIMS to celebrate 'Oystober' throughout the month

Throughout the month of October, the Virginia Institute of Marine Science will "Ovstober"—a celebrate month dedicated to learning more about oysters through lectures, oyster-themed lab tours, and special events online and in-person.

Oyster tour VIMS will have a special Oyster Tour Tuesday from 1:30-3 p.m., beginning at Watermen's Hall on the VIMS campus. During this tour, attendees will learn about the cutting-edge research taking place at VIMS that helps the institution understand the biology and ecology of the oysters that support the growing shellfish aquaculture industry.

Attendees will visit the VIMS Oyster Hatchery where Dr. Jessica Small will show them how VIMS research has helped produce the perfect dinner-table oyster. Guests will also visit the Shellfish Pathology Lab where Dr. Ryan Carnegie will describe how his team works to understand oyster diseases and keep the aquaculture industry safe and thriving.





### Rain garden


A year after volunteers installed rain gardens on the historic Mathews court green, the plants are thriving. Paid for entirely with private funds, the project involved planting a variety of moisture-loving species to soak up the rainwater that in the past left the grounds in a muddy mess.
