"Spaying and neutering has a significant impact on our community," said Six. "Just one unaltered female dog and her offspring can produce 67,000 puppies in only six years. In seven years, one female cat and her offspring can produce an incredible 370,000 kittens. By offering affordable spay and neuter services, our goal is to alter as many animals as possible to help control the pet population.

In an effort to further increase access to services, the clinic has debuted Wellness Package Deals. Available only at time of surgery, package deals provide pets with rabies vaccine, DHPP or FVRCP vaccine, microchipping, heart-worm test or Feline Leukemia/FIV Test, nail trim and ear cleaning. The package price represents a 10 percent discount on the cost of individual services listed. All services
