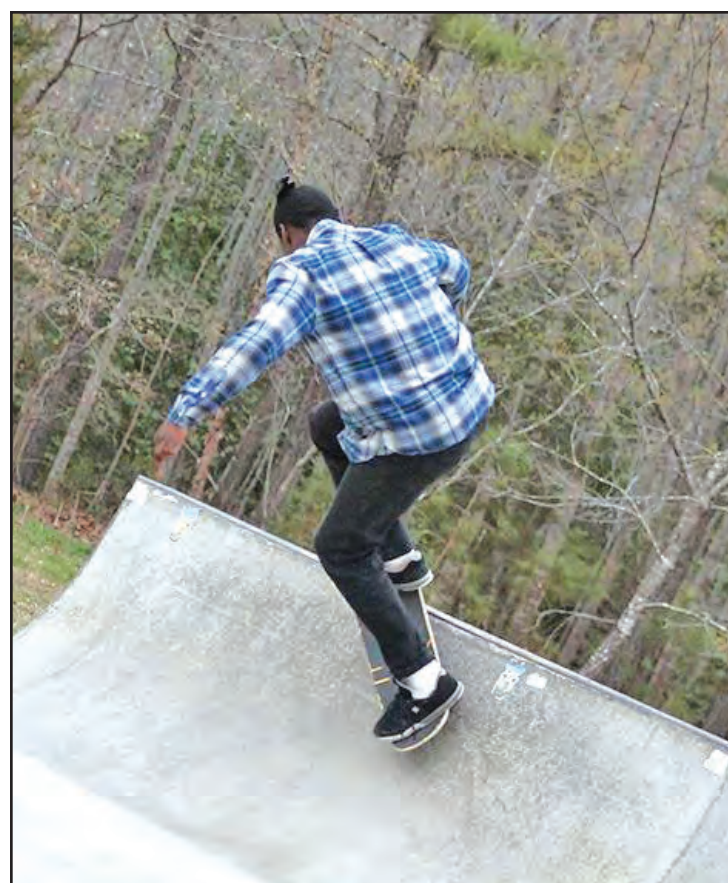

Gloucester Arts Festival returns this year

The Gloucester Arts Festival makes its return this year after having been canceled last year due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

This year's Plein Air Festival will feature 20 artists from across the country who

will paint outdoor scenes in Gloucester.

Chairman for this year's festival Mollie Stewart had to make the decision last year whether or not to hold this year's festival. She figured by June 2021, Gloucester could have an outdoor festival since the community is small. Still,

this was a risk due to the amount of time, work and planning that goes into each festival.

"It takes a tremendous amount of preparation," said Stewart.

She decided to take the festival to the next level by planning each event outdoors to keep the festival COVID safe.

This year's festival kicked off on June 3 with the Sculpture Unveiling and Talk by Artist Jay Lageman. Attendees walked along Main Street as each sculpture was unveiled and learned the story and inspiration behind each one.

The popular "Symphony Under the Stars" was held on June 5 at Woodville Park. The Virginia Symphony Orchestra gave the free concert while the plein air artists painted live during the event.

The Plein Air Outdoor Gala at Sussex on the York River will begin at 5:30 p.m. Friday. The gala will include a cocktail hour and an art sale. This is a ticketed event.

On Saturday, the community can enjoy "Paint Main 2.0." The festival painters will be competing in a fast-paced "paint-out" along Main Street from 10 a.m. until noon. Attendees can walk along Main Street and watch the artists painting. Larry Moore will announce the winners of the competition and award prizes at 12:30 p.m.

On Sunday, Moore will be giving a lecture on "The Cre-

Gloucester Parks & Recreation planning a more normal summer

After its typical summer plans were foiled by the COVID-19 pandemic last year, Gloucester Parks, Recreation & Tourism has planned a more normal summer for the community.

"Last summer we weren't able to do much of anything," said Katey Legg, director of Gloucester Parks, Recreation & Tourism.

Legg said that the department will offer more programs this summer than it did last summer.

Gloucester Parks & Rec will continue to utilize the county parks this summer to remain COVID safe. More programs will be held at Beaverdam and Woodville parks, like kayak opportunities, night hikes and night fishing. Since it does not have a recreation center, Parks & Rec will use Whitcomb Lodge at Beaverdam Park for some of its programs.

Concerts on the Green will make a return this summer after being canceled last year after only one concert.

"Too much was changing too fast," said Legg about

COVID rules and regulations.

The department has decided to move the concerts from the Court Circle to the lawn of County Building Two to give people plenty of room to spread out.

These concerts are free, family-friendly events. There are seven concerts in total lined up for the summer. Each concert will begin at 6 p.m. and will be held on Wednesdays, June 2, June 16, June 30, July 14, Aug. 4, Aug. 18 and Sept. 1. Performers, in order of appearance, include Toby & Larry, Just Dan, St. Juliens Creek Revival, Those Guys, Clan MacCool, Courthouse Orchestra, and Good Shot Judy.

Legg would like to remind people that alcohol is not permitted on county property. In case of rain call the Parks & Rec PlayLine at 804-693-5811 for updates on performances.

There will also be a movie shown at Woodville Park in August. Movie selection will be announced at a later date.

"Lots of good things are happening," said Legg.

Summer activities include camps with specialty interests. Two performing arts camps will be directed by Karen Scalf.

Disney will be the theme of the camp for ages 8-11, which will meet from 9 a.m. to noon. For girls ages 12-17 the camp theme is "Show Music Choir." This camp meets from 1-4 p.m. The fee for each camp is \$59; both will be held at T.C. Walker from June 28-July 1. The deadline to register is June 21.

Also, PRT will hold Experience Gloucester History Day Camp on July 19-23 from 9 a.m. to noon each day at the Gloucester Museum of History. Rising fourth and fifth graders will explore Gloucester's court circle, the museum, the Rosewell ruins, and a Revolutionary War encampment. The fee is \$59 and the deadline to register is July 12.

Last year when the pandemic was in full swing, Gloucester parks saw heavy use. "Our parks were the only things open for months," said Legg.

According to Legg, Beaverdam Park had a 20 percent increase in traffic and Brown Park experienced a 400 percent increase. Legg said that her staff worked hard to keep the parks running

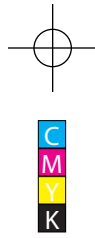
